Board of Commissioners Return to In-person Public Meetings; Public comment must be Made In-Person or In Advance of the Meeting.

Residents are advised that Springfield Township, Montgomery County, PA, has resumed in-person meetings for the Board of Commissioners and all of the Township's Advisory Boards.

PA Act 15 of 2020 allowed all local governments in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to conduct fully virtual or teleconference meetings while the Governor's emergency disaster declaration associated with the COVID-19 Pandemic was in effect. Since the disaster declaration was terminated with the passage of HR 106 by the State Legislature, local governments are now required to go back to pre-declaration conditions and conduct in-person meetings.

As a result, the Township will start to conduct in-person Board of Commissioners meetings starting with the July 12th monthly workshop meeting. A Zoom link will be provided for all future workshop meetings, starting with the July 12th meeting, for residents to live stream via Zoom. Please be advised that public comment will only be accepted from in-person members of the public or those who have submitted a comment in advance of the meeting. Virtual participants will only be able to view the meeting and will not have the ability to provide public comment through Zoom.

The Township is actively taking steps to improve its audio/visual equipment to enhance the use of Zoom for in-person Board of Commissioners Meetings. The Township is hopeful that the new equipment will facilitate the continued use of Zoom as a medium for public engagement in Board of Commissioners meetings and will be operational before the end of summer.

The Board of Commissioners and Township staff appreciate the tremendous patience and understanding that residents have displayed over the past year with the transition to virtual conferencing for conducting official business. It is the hope of the Township that the audio/visual improvements made will demonstrate its continuous commitment to encourage engagement in and awareness of public matters that impact the entire Springfield Township community.
