## INCIDENTS

11/13/23 – 1200 block Bethlehem Pike – Officers located a suspicious vehicle parked in the area with an occupant inside. After contacting the occupant, it was determined to be an Uber driver who was resting prior to driving home for the night. Officers quickly cleared the call and sent the driver on his way.

11/13/23 – 100 block Montgomery Avenue, Erdenheim – An Officer responded to a report of a theft from vehicle with a window smashed that occurred between 4:00 PM and 4:47 PM. A black leather purse was stolen which contained a wallet with currency and credit cards. The suspect was sitting in a black SUV, and the investigation is continuing.

11/14/23 – 1400 block Bethlehem Pike – An Officer responded to take a report of currency stolen from a purse that had been left on an outside table. The purse was found in a dumpster with other contents intact minus the currency, and the investigation is continuing.

11/14/23 – Paper Mill Road/Route 309 Ramp – Officers were dispatched to the area for several deceased deer in the area. Officers quickly located the deer and contacted the Pennsylvania Game Commission where a Game Warden was dispatched to investigate the activity. This incident is currently being handled by the Pennsylvania Game Commission and the Springfield Township Police Department will assist when more information is gathered.

11/15/23 – 1100 block St. Clair Road – Officers were dispatched to the area after a homeowner discovered that someone had stolen their packages from their porch. The homeowner saw the crime through their Ring door camera. Officers quickly responded to the area and were able to locate the vehicle in connection with the theft. After further investigating, an adult female was taken into custody for Theft and Receiving Stolen Property.

11/18/23 – 1300 block Churchill Rd – Officers were dispatched to the area for “someone yelling in the area.” Several Officers responded to the area and were directed toward the backyards of residences of Churchill Rd. Upon Officers arriving, the area was quiet. Responding Officers continued to float the area and maintain a high presence in the event any further activity continued.

11/19/23 – 1600 block Bethlehem Pike – Officers were dispatched to a local business after five male subjects entered the store and filled their bags and pockets with merchandise. The

subjects fled the area prior to the police arriving. Officers proceeded to canvass the area while another Officer went to the business to try and obtain video footage of the incident. Officers were not able to locate the individuals but will continue to monitor the area and the business for further activity.
