INCIDENTS

2/5/24 – 200 block Montgomery Avenue Erdenheim – Officers were dispatched to a delayed report of a vehicle that was broken into. When Officers arrived, they met with the complainant that showed a broken window from the vehicle and that their purse was stolen as a result. Unfortunately, due to not having a description, Officers were unable to locate the actor in this matter.

2/6/24 – Haws Lane/Wedgewood Road – Officers were dispatched for a report of two males in a physical altercation. When Officers arrived, both parties were separated. It was discovered that this incident occurred over an employee being late for work. Subsequently, a non-traffic citation was issued to the male who started the fight.

2/6/24 – 800 block Church Road – Officers were dispatched for three suspicious males that were captured on a ring camera. The males had arrived in a black van with ladders on top. When they arrived in the area, they got out of their vehicle, walked around a property, and left. Responding Officers were unable to locate the vehicle in question. Officers spoke to the property owner, to which nothing was reported stolen or tampered with.

2/7/24 – 300 block Lyster Road – Officers were dispatched to the area for a subject “creeping” around a house. Officers were able to obtain a description of the juvenile from a surveillance camera within the area. The homeowner reported that there was not any property damaged, stolen, or tampered with. It is believed that the juvenile was participating in a game of “ding-dong-ditch”. Officers canvassed the area for an extended period but were unable to locate the juvenile.

2/10/24 – Paper Mill Road/St. Clair Road – Officers were dispatched to a report of shots fired. Several Officers responded to the area. It was quickly identified to be fireworks in the area. The Abington Township Police Department were also receiving similar calls in bordering neighborhoods. Officers continued to patrol the area to confirm that it was only fireworks being used. No other incidents were reported in this manner.
