INCIDENTS

3/11/24 – unit block Jones Avenue – Officers were dispatched to the area for a reported vehicle accident involving a parked car. After arriving on scene, Officers spoke with the operator of the striking vehicle and detected signs of impairment. Officers conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests of the driver and determined that there were in fact signs of impairment. The driver was taken into custody under the suspicion of driving under the influence.

3/12/24 – 800 block Willow Grove Avenue – Officers were dispatched to the area along with the Fire Department after receiving reports of a vehicle accident and one of the cars was on its side. Officers shut down the roadway and conducted an accident investigation. Officers spoke with one of the drivers involved in the crash and detected signs of impairment. Officers conducted standardized field sobriety tests on the driver and determined that there were signs of impairment. The driver was taken into custody under the suspicion of driving under the influence.

3/13/24 – 9200 block Ridge Pike – Officers were notified by the Pennsylvania State Police that a subject with an active arrest warrant was attempting to purchase a handgun at a local gun shop. Officers responded to the scene and took the suspect into custody on the active warrant.

3/14/24 – unit Block Park Avenue – Officers were dispatched to the area for a reported disturbance on a Septa Train. Septa Transit Police requested that Springfield Officers respond as they would have a delayed response. When Officers arrived, the train was no longer on location, and the incident was turned back over to the Septa Transit Police for further investigation.

3/17/24 – 1500 block Bethlehem Pike – While on patrol, Officers conducted a stop on a pedestrian, and it was determined that there were active arrest warrants out of Philadelphia and Virginia. After verifying the identity of the individual, the subject was detained awaiting confirmation of the warrants, and then taken into custody and transported to the Philadelphia Police Department on their warrant.
