§114.21. Definition of Terms

[Add alphabetically as appropriate]

Addition

An extension or increase in floor area, number or stories, or height of an existing building or structure.

Adult Day Care

A facility licensed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in which care is provided for adults for a portion of a 24-hour day through a structured, community-based program which provides health, social, and other related support services.

Athletic Club

A facility intended to encourage physical conditioning activities by the general public through the use of exercise, gymnastics, facilities and equipment. Health-oriented treatments, including medication and massage, are not included in nor authorized by this definition.

Automatic Self-Service Laundry

A business premises equipped with individual clothes-washing and/or drying machines for the use of retail customers.

Bank/Financial Institution

Includes savings and loan, finance companies, credit unions and other similar financial or fiduciary institutions.

Banquet Hall or Conference Center

A room or building for the purpose of hosting a party, banquet, wedding or other reception, or other public assembly.

Bed-and-Breakfast

A building used for the purpose of furnishing temporary lodging to guests' together with food service to such guests, limited to breakfast and sometimes lunch or afternoon tea, prepared and served on site only to such guests, and having an owner or manager in residence on the property. A Bed-and-Breakfast shall contain lodging for no more than 15 guests at any one time. Such temporary lodging would normally be for a few nights and typically would not exceed a week.

Car Wash

A facility that cleans the exterior and/or interior of motor vehicles.

Commercial School

Commented [SCD1]: As discussed, I am wary of adding defined terms that should apply to the entire ZO unless we very carefully review how these terms are used in other sections of the ZO. I appreciate the clarity that a defined term may create, but inconsistency can result in problems for the Township. The other issue with defining terms is that uses can be unintentionally left out of a defined term. Sometimes, using undefined terms allows for a broader interpretation, which gives the Township more leeway.

Also – Where are these definitions coming from? A model ordinance? I think we need to be very careful that where we decide to add defined terms, they fit in with the existing ZO.

A private, for profit vocational, avocational, trade, arts, performing arts, or other skill teaching institution or training provider that is not a primary, secondary, or post-secondary school or college.

Community Recreation Center/Facility

A facility maintained principally as a multiple-purpose gathering place for members of the general public, or a limited portion thereof. The community center may include a management office comprising no more than 15% of the gross floor area as an accessory use to manage the center and related facilities.

Convenience Store

A retail store selling a variety of food, beverages, drugs, reading material or house-hold supplies and having a floor area not exceeding 3,000 square feet.

Extended Care Facility

A building, except a hospital, used for the care, treatment or lodging for three or more persons who are either infirm, afflicted or suffering from any chronic physical or mental disease, illness or affliction.

Fast Food Restaurant

A type of restaurant that offers relatively immediate service of semi-prepared or prepared foods for take-out or in-house consumption in disposable containers and serving walk-in and/or drive-through customers.

Floor Area

The sum of the gross horizontal areas of each floor of a building, measured from the exterior faces of exterior walls or from the center line of party walls. The term does not include any area used exclusively for the parking of motor vehicles (surface or structured parking).

Funeral Home

A building used for the preparation of the deceased for burial and the display of the deceased and rituals connected therewith before burial or cremation. A crematorium may be included upon special exception approval.

Gallery or Museum

Museum or gallery open to the public and not conducted as a private, gainful business.

Gasoline Service Station

Any area of land, including structures thereon or any building or part thereof, that is used for the retail sale of gasoline or other motor vehicle fuel or accessories and which may or may not include facilities for lubricating, washing or otherwise servicing motor vehicles, but which shall not include painting or body and fender repairs. Any facility

Golf Club

An area designed for the play of the game of golf containing greens, tees, fairways, bunkers and related areas and may include a club house, restaurant, and other associated social and athletic uses.

Hospital

An institution providing primary physical or mental health services and medical or surgical care of the sick, handicapped or injured including facilities for overnight accommodation of patients. Hospitals may include various ancillary activities which are customarily incidental to and in direct support of the primary health care mission of the hospital. Such ancillary activities would include clinics, medical offices, hospital administrative offices, laboratories, pharmacies, gift shops, teaching facilities, research facilities, rehabilitation facilities, patient hostels, hospital staff dormitory, employee day care, and diagnostic or treatment facilities which are integrated with the hospital facilities.

Hotel

A series of three or more dwelling units devoted mainly to the housing of transients and having on-site parking space and commercial facilities for the use of its occupants.

Indoor Amusements

A commercial business or facility where games are played for amusement as the primary use.

Medical Office

An office building used exclusively by medical practitioners for the treatment and examination of patients, provided that patients are not kept overnight.

Motor Vehicle Sales

A business that stores an inventory of automobiles motor vehicles and buys, sells, and/or leases said automobiles motor vehicles. This includes Public Garages as accessory to the sales.

Laboratory

A building or group of buildings in which are located the facilities for scientific research, teaching and learning, investigation, testing and experimentation but not including the manufacture of products for sale.

Office

A building in which services are performed by a member of a profession, including but not limited to an accountant, architect, author, community planner, dentist, engineer, insurance

Personal Care Business

A personal care business requires direct, physical contact with the customer in the performance of a personal service, and shall include such uses as barber, beautician, nail technician, and tattooing.

Pharmacy

A facility used for the practice and profession of preparing, preserving, compounding, and dispensing medical drugs or cosmetic material. A pharmacy which displays more than 40% of the gross floor area of the pharmacy in food products normally sold in grocery stores shall be considered a super market.

Professional Service Business

Such use shall include businesses which typically offer service in conjunction with the sale of goods. Such uses differ from other retail or from office businesses in that the customer area is separated from the service area, and some form of laboratory, fabrication area or processing area is necessary. Such use includes but is not limited to shoe repair, tailor, photography studio, copying service, dental lab, eyeglass labs, and other similar uses.

Restaurant, Bar, or Tavern

A store where prepared food or drink is sold to patrons and consumed on premises in an area dedicated for this purpose.

School or College

A public, private or parochial institution dedicated to the education and training of children and/or adults, which is approved and accredited for the educational purposes which it is intended to perform by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Self-Storage Facility

A building or group of buildings that contain individual, compartmentalized and controlled-access stalls or lockers for the dead storage of customers' goods or wares, also known as "mini-warehouses."

Shopping Center

A shopping area of integrated design and development, including but not limited to such uses as retail shops, personal service establishments, professional and business offices, banks, post offices, restaurants, theaters and auditoriums, housed in an enclosed building or buildings and utilizing such common facilities as customer parking, pedestrian walks, loading and unloading space, utilities and sanitary facilities.

A retail market selling a variety of foods and household items.

Theater

A building or outdoor area in which plays, films, and other dramatic performances are given.

Train Station Commuter Rail Station

A facility which incorporates, but is not limited to, a railroad station building, including ticket office, passenger waiting room, taxi stand and bus shelter, canopies, platforms, parking areas for the use of commuters, patrons and employees, passenger pickup areas, bus layover areas and appurtenant features which provide safe, convenient and amenable boarding, alighting and waiting for a passenger train or other transportation services. Also referred to as transportation passenger station or passenger station.

Vehicular Service Station

The servicing, repair, of automobiles; including the sale and installation of lubricants, tires, batteries and similar vehicle accessories, which may also include facilities used for polishing, greasing, washing, painting, body work, or cleaning vehicles.

Veterinary Clinic or Animal Hospital

An establishment operated by a licensed veterinarian for the care, treatment and prevention of diseases and injuries of domestic animals and where animals may be boarded as part of their care.

Worship Space

Property owned by and utilized by a religious organization for public worship by a congregation, including religious school, ancillary and accessory uses
