2/28/24 – New Street/Campbell Lane – Officers were dispatched to a minor accident. When arriving on location, it appeared that an operator struck a parked vehicle while driving. After further investigation, Officers conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests where it was determined that the driver was impaired and was taken into custody under the suspicion of DUI.

3/2/24 – 8800 block Stenton Avenue – Officers were dispatched to the area for a report of a suspicious vehicle. A local resident reported that the driver of the vehicle was possibly under the influence after seeing erratic driving behavior. Officers located the vehicle and stopped it to further investigate the matter. The Officers conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests, where it was determined that the driver was impaired. The driver was subsequently taken into custody under the suspicion of DUI.

3/3/24 – 1600 block Bethlehem Pike – Officers were dispatched to the area after receiving a panic alarm for a commercial truck driver. The monitoring alarm agency were unable to contact the driver and requested police respond. Officers were able to locate the vehicle in question and confirm that it was an accidental activation by the driver.
