INCIDENTS

4/15/24 – 1300 block Bethlehem Pike – Officers were dispatched to a motor vehicle theft in progress. Several Officers responded to canvass the area in search of the vehicle but were unsuccessful with their results. Neighboring municipalities were notified of the vehicle description as well.

4/15/24 – 200 block Plymouth Avenue – Officers were dispatched to a residence for a fraud report. While on location, the Officers contacted a male that had an active arrest warrant from the Pottstown Borough Police Department and the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. Both agencies confirmed the warrant, and the male was taken into custody without issue.

4/16/24 – 1600 block Bethlehem Pike – Officers were dispatched to the area for a retail theft in progress at a local business. When Officers contacted the suspect, she provided fraudulent identification. After further speaking to her, Officers were able to confirm her identity. She was subsequently taken into custody for retail theft and false identification to law enforcement. It was later revealed that the female had an active warrant for her arrest out of Delaware County.

4/19/24 - 400 block Drayton Road – An Officer responded to investigate a fraud case involving the victim receiving a phone call from an individual who claimed that there was an unpaid balance on the PECO bill and that service would be shut off for nonpayment. The victim made two separate payments through a Zelle app and determined after the fact the person who called was not from PECO.
