INCIDENTS

5/29/24 – 1800 block Paper Mill Road – Police were dispatched to the area for a report of juveniles with drugs. When Officers arrived on scene, they located drugs on one of the juveniles who was ultimately taken into custody for drug possession offenses.

5/29/24 – Stenton Avenue/Hillcrest Avenue – Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle and the driver had an active warrant for their arrest. Prior to taking the subject into custody, Officers detected an odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. A search warrant for the vehicle was obtained and executed, and charges were filed accordingly.

5/30/24 – 600 block Haws Lane -- Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle, and the driver had an active warrant for their arrest. The subject was taken into custody without issue and was ultimately transferred to the agency that had the warrant issued.

5/31/24 – Stenton Avenue/Hillcrest Avenue -- Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle, and the driver had an active warrant for their arrest. The subject was taken into custody without issue and was ultimately transferred to the agency that had the warrant issued.

5/31/24 – Unit Block Apel Ave – The Springfield Township Police Department Criminal Investigation Division investigated and executed search warrants which uncovered evidence to charge a 33-year-old male who was involved in Trafficking in Individuals and Sexual Abuse of Minors. The suspect in this case was previously employed as a substitute teacher as well as an umpire for local little league organizations. At least four victims have been identified within Pennsylvania and Alabama.
