5/29/24 – 1800 block Paper Mill Road – Police were dispatched to the area for a report of juveniles with drugs. When Officers arrived on scene, they located drugs on one of the juveniles who was ultimately taken into custody for drug possession offenses.

Prior to taking the subject into custody, Officers detected an odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. A search warrant for the vehicle was obtained and executed, and charges were filed accordingly.

5/31/24 – Unit Block Apel Ave – The Springfield Township Police Department Criminal Investigation Division investigated and executed search warrants which uncovered evidence to charge a 33-year-old male who was involved in Trafficking in Individuals and Sexual Abuse of Minors. The suspect in this case was previously employed as a substitute teacher as well as an umpire for local little league organizations. At least four victims have been identified within Pennsylvania and Alabama.
