INCIDENTS

6/25/24 – 700 block Willow Grove Avenue – Officers were dispatched to a suspicious vehicle with a driver that appeared to be sleeping on the side of the road. When Officers arrived on scene, they located the vehicle running with the operator asleep behind the wheel. Officers conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and determined that the operator had signs of impairment. The driver was taken into custody for DUI as well as possession of a controlled substance.

6/25/24 – 200 block Station Avenue – Officers were dispatched to a burglary in progress reported by a neighbor. Springfield Officers and Detectives arrived on scene, but the actor had already fled the area. They were able to obtain camera footage of the incident to identify the vehicle. Surrounding agencies were notified of the suspect's vehicle. This incident is still under investigation, no further details are available at this time.

6/25/24 – 8200 block Limekiln Pike (Cheltenham Twp) – Springfield Township Officers responded to assist the Cheltenham Police Department after a male pulled out a gun while on a traffic stop. Several Officers responded to the scene to get the situation under control. The suspect in this incident is involved with the burglary case listed above. This incident is under investigation by the Cheltenham Township Police Department as they are the agency having jurisdiction.

6/27/24 – 100 block Atwood Road – Officers were dispatched to the area for a delayed report of vehicle break-ins as well as a stolen vehicle. Due to the delay, Officers were unable to canvass the area to locate the vehicle that was stolen. The car that was stolen was located in Camden, New Jersey later that day and was processed for possible latent fingerprints by Detectives.

6/27/24 – 1400 block Ivy Hill Road – Springfield Police were notified by the Upper Moreland Police Department of a stolen vehicle that may be at a local business within the Township. Officers responded to the business in question and located the vehicle and a male occupant. The male was taken into custody and the vehicle was impounded. The vehicle, suspect, and case were turned over to the Upper Moreland Police Department.
