### INCIDENTS:

4/15/25 – While on patrol, an officer observed a vehicle partially blocking the gas pumps at a gas station on the 600 block of Bethlehem Pike. The lights were off, and the business was closed for the night, so the officer approached the vehicle. The officer observed heavy front-end damage with one occupant and the driver's side door was open. As the officer approached the vehicle, he could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage that grew stronger as he made contact with the driver. The driver was unable to explain the damage to the front of the car and was showing visible signs of impairment. Officers checked the parking lot briefly for damage to the property with negative results. Due to the driver admitting to driving the vehicle from center city and showing signs of impairment, officers conducted Standardized Field Sobriety tests. The driver was placed into custody and processed for suspicion of DUI, then released to an Uber.

4/15/25 – Police were dispatched to the leasing office of an apartment complex on the 9800 block of Germantown Pike for a report of threats. Upon positively identifying the male subject and the female that was also on location to visit him, officers confirmed that both the male and female had active warrants. The male and female were taken into custody to serve their warrants.

4/16/25 – Police were dispatched to the 1000 block of W Heather Road for the report of a male who broke the caller's back window. As officers arrived in the area, one officer made a pedestrian stop on a juvenile male who matched the description given by the caller. While speaking with the juvenile, he admitted to breaking a window to one house and ripping a window screen from another house. He was taken into custody, referred to the Youth Aid Panel program, and released to his parents.
