INCIDENTS:

4/28/25 – Police were dispatched to Fairwold Academy on the 2100 block of Pennsylvania Ave for a late report of a fight. The officer was informed that four students attacked another student. He was able to view the security footage and then speak to the students involved. Those students have been charged with harassment.

4/30/25 – While enroute to an unrelated call, an officer observed a male panhandling on the corner of Stenton Ave and Mermaid Ln. After clearing the call, the officer went back to check on the male who as unsteady on his feet. The male gave his identity to the officer, and it came back with active warrants out of Montgomery County. The male was taken into custody and transported to the county court house.

5/1/25 – Police were dispatched to the TD Bank on the 1200 block of Bethlehem Pike for a report of a female attempting to cash a fraudulent check. Officers arrived and made contact with the female who stated that her boyfriend drove her there and gave a description of the vehicle. Another arriving officer saw the vehicle on the side street and pulled up behind it. The officer activated his emergency lights and the vehicle began to drive away. Another officer pulled in front of the car and was able to stop it from fleeing. One female and four males were taken into custody for forgery, conspiracy of forgery, bad checks, possessing instruments of crime, possession of drug paraphernalia, and more.

5/3/25 – Police were dispatched to 100 block of Plymouth Ave for the report of a gun that was dumped into the sewer. A resident observed a male get out of his vehicle to throw something into the sewer. When the male was gone, the resident went over, saw that it was a handgun, and called police. The gun was retrieved and the case was turned over to detectives. An investigation is ongoing.
