### INCIDENTS:

5/12/25 – A female came to the station to turn herself in and was taken into custody on our warrant.

5/12/25 – While conducting a pedestrian stop on Stenton Ave, an officer confirmed the identification of a male who had an active warrant. The male was taken into custody on our local warrant.

5/16/25 – While conducting intersection enforcement at Paper Mill Rd and 309, an officer observed a vehicle turn right on red and conducted a traffic stop. While speaking with the driver, the officer could smell unburnt marijuana emanating from the vehicle. The driver and passenger were both asked to provide identification. The passenger opened the glove box to retrieve paperwork, and the officer saw a mason jar containing marijuana. The passenger admitted to purchasing it and was taken into custody for possession of marijuana.

5/17/25 – Springfield police officers were dispatched and responded to assist with a large fight on Linden Ave in Upper Dublin Township.

5/18/25 – Police were dispatched to the 100 block of Atwood Rd for the report of a vehicle accident. Upon arrival, police observed a vehicle that had struck an unoccupied parked vehicle head on, after sideswiping two other parked vehicles. The driver of the vehicle admitted to police that he had been drinking, and empty beer bottles were observed in the vehicle. Police conducted standard field sobriety tests and a portable breath test. Based on police observations and performance of the tests given, he was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI.
