INCIDENTS:

6/4/25 – Police responded to a report of a physical domestic at the Penn Weldy Apartments on the 1300 block of Pennsylvania Ave. It was reported that the male half left the scene, and police located the vehicle matching the description on Willow Grove Ave. The vehicle began to pass vehicles in the oncoming traffic lane. Police then conducted a traffic stop. The driver admitted to coming from the Penn Weldy Apartments and police confirmed the identity of the driver, which matched the name provided by the victim. The male was taken into custody and charged with simple assault.

6/7/25 – While traveling southbound on Bethlehem Pike at Hillcrest Ave, an officer observed a vehicle traveling northbound in the southbound lanes, which is separated by a median. The vehicle almost collided into a car head on. The officer turned around and conducted a traffic stop at the Lukoil. Upon contact with the driver, he stated that he was traveling home but could not tell officers where home was. The driver eventually admitted to having alcoholic beverages that evening, and officers administered the Field Sobriety Tests. Due to driving in the wrong lane of traffic and the results of the tests, the male was taken into custody for DUI.

6/7/25 – Police were dispatched to the report of a male on the property after an incident from earlier in the evening. The male was told not to return to this property and not to contact the complainant following a domestic call. While in the area, the officers observed the male's vehicle driving back toward the house. A traffic stop was initiated on the 700 block of Hartwell Ave. The male was unable to follow instructions given by officers and was unable to hold his balance while exiting his vehicle. While speaking with the male, officers detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath. Due to these circumstances and the results of the Field Sobriety Tests, the male was taken into custody for DUI and harassment.
