INCIDENTS:

11/18/2025 – Police were dispatched to a vehicle accident on the unit block of W Mill Rd. The driver told police he crashed into a parked vehicle after looking down at his cell phone. While speaking to the driver, officers detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage and observed vomit on his clothing. Officers conducted Standard Field Sobriety Tests and took the driver into custody for suspicion of DUI.

11/20/2025 – Police were dispatched to a theft-in-progress at the Fine Wine and Good Spirits on the 1400 of Bethlehem Pike and were provided a description of the female and her vehicle. Upon arrival, officers observed her leaving the parking lot and initiated a traffic stop. The female's identification was confirmed, and she was taken into custody and charged with retail theft.

11/21/2025 – Springfield Police, along with other local police departments, assisted the Cheltenham Township Police Department with a search for a subject that fled from a car stop.

11/23/2025 – Police observed a male walking southbound on Bethlehem Pike repeatedly looking back at the patrol vehicle. A short time later, the officer saw him again, now holding his fanny pack under his arm and avoiding eye contact. After the male continued to evade the police vehicle, the officer stopped to speak with him. The male acted suspiciously but eventually provided identification, and the county dispatcher confirmed multiple active arrest warrants. He was taken into custody, and a search of his fanny pack revealed suspected controlled substances and drug paraphernalia.
