### **INCIDENTS:**

12/31/2025 – While on patrol, an officer observed a vehicle stopped on the shoulder of the roadway on Bethlehem Pike. The officer pulled next to the vehicle and asked if the driver was okay. He was slurring his words and the officer could not understand him. The vehicle drove away and the officer observed it driving over the shoulder multiple times as well as drifting over to the median. The officer initiated a traffic stop and the driver admitted to drinking “earlier.” The driver consented to take the standardized field sobriety tests. Due to the results of the tests and signs of impairment, he was taken into custody for suspicion of DUI.

12/31/2025 – Police were dispatched to Montgomery Ave and Paper Mill Rd for an Uber driver needing police assistance. Upon arrival, the driver explained that he was driving two passengers in the back seat when the male grabbed him by the neck with one arm. The passengers arranged for another ride home and the male was charged with harassment.

12/31/2025 – Police were dispatched to the 8100 block of Gladstone Rd for a complaint of increased parking on the road. Police observed a house that was having a large party. The host of the party admitted that it got out of control and officers were able to break up the party and made sure everyone got a ride or an Uber.

12/31/2025 – While police were breaking up the large party on Gladstone Rd, one of the vehicles leaving hit on the license plate reader as a stolen vehicle. Police pulled in front of the vehicle, but it drove over the curb and took off at a high rate of speed. Officers searched the area but could not locate the vehicle.

1/2/2025 – A subject was taken into custody on an arrest warrant in relation to multiple reports of vandalism and criminal mischief to vehicles in the Wyndmoor section of the township.
