INCIDENTS:

2/24/2026 – Police took a report of a stolen vehicle on the 1400 block of Bethlehem Pike. The investigation is ongoing.

2/26/2026 – Police were dispatched to Wyndmoor Hills Rehabilitation Center on the 8600 block of Stenton Ave for a male posing as another person. The male was giving the identity of someone else in an attempt to sign his family member out of the facility. Once police confirmed his real identity, county radio advised that he had two outstanding arrest warrants. He was placed in custody and upon searching him, officers found drugs. The male was charged with possession and false identification to law enforcement.

2/28/2026 – Police were dispatched to the 800 block of Skyline Drive for an unrecognized vehicle in the caller's driveway. When police arrived, the vehicle was running, the windshield wipers were on, and the vehicle had appeared to have collided with a low retaining wall along the driveway. The male in the driver's seat was unconscious but woke up shortly after their arrival. Due to the driver's state and slurred words, officers performed Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. The male was then taken into custody for suspicion of DUI.

2/28/2026 – Police were dispatched to the Giant Food Store on the 1800 block of Bethlehem Pike for a delayed report of theft. Giant's loss prevention provided the officer with video footage of the two females and their vehicle and tag registration. With this, police were able to confirm the identifications of the females and charges have been filed for retail theft.
